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Background of UN-GGIM

- Established in 2011 by The Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC)
- Committee of Experts on Global Geospatial Information Management (UN-GGIM)
- UNGGIM comprises of experts from all Member States, as well as experts from international organizations as observers



Work of UN-GGIM

- The Committee of Experts is mandated, among other tasks to:
 - provide a platform for the development of effective strategies on how to build and strengthen national capacity on geospatial information
 - disseminate best practices and experiences of national, regional and international bodies on geospatial information related to legal instruments, management models and technical standards.



10th Session

- Was held in a scaled down virtual format
- 26-27 August and 4 September 2020 due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic
- Over eighty delegations from Member States participated in each of the three meetings.



10th Session

- The substantive interactions of the tenth session were facilitated through a the submission of written statements, introductory statements for each of the substantive agenda items
- Fiji provided statements on 3 agenda items:
 - Agenda item #5 Integrated Geospatial Information Framework
 - Agenda item #6 Global geodetic reference frame
 - Agenda item #9 Application of geospatial information related to land administration and management



10th Report and Decisions

Notable discussions and decisions include:

- Adopted the Implementation Guide of the IGIF, subject to further refinement and its finalization
- Welcomed and supported the offer from the Federal Republic of Germany to establish and host a Global Geodetic Centre of Excellence at the United Nations Campus in Bonn, Germany
- Adopted the Framework for Effective Land Administration
- Adoption of standards for the global geospatial information community



Fiji and UN-GGIM UN Development Account Project

Continues with Ministry of Lands to develop a country level action plan to further the NGIMS and geospatial initiatives in Fiji

- Currently working on the Needs Analysis and Gap Analysis Report
- Once this is completed a draft of the country level action plan will be submitted to the FGIMC for consideration



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
