Responsibilities of National Fire Authority (NFA)

- In exercising its powers under the National Fire Service Act 1995, NFA Responsibilities includes;
 - Corporate Governance including the establishment of NFA Subcommittees
 - Administration and Operation of National Fire Services
 - Establishing strategies and Objectives
 - Monitoring the performance of Management
 - Ensuring effective and efficient communication with all stakeholders
 - Appointment of the Officers of NFA except for the CEO who is appointed by the Minister
 - Ensuring an effective Human Resources Program for the NFA
 - Overseeing the development for Senior and highperformance services.



Services of National Fire Authority (NFA)

- The essential services provided by the NFA no longer just evolves Fire fighting, but they are also providing;
 - Responding to Road accident rescue operation
 - Hazarders material responds and rescue operation
 - Flood and swift water rescue operation
 - Provide Emergency Ambulance services and First Aid assistance
 - Carrying out Urban Search Rescue Operation
 - Structural Fire Safety Inspection

National Fire Authority Fire Boundaries

1. Efficient Response and Reduced Response Time:

- A precise street address enables fire services to locate an incident site quickly. (Lot 49 Duvula Rd)
- Ensuring firefighters respond accurately.
- Identification of the nearest Fire Hydrant to the incident site.
- Reduces response times.
- Increases survival rate of stranded victims



2. Improved Accuracy in Navigation

 Many areas in Fiji may lack clear landmarks, making specific street addresses essential for navigation. With accurate addresses, responders can avoid confusion or delays, especially in urban areas with complex road networks.

Woman in wheelchair died after Melbourne firefighters went to wrong address, coroner finds

It took more than two hours for emergency services to find a woman in a wheelchair inside a burning home after she called for help.

Firefighters, who may have been relying on a printed map, initially went to the wrong address. By the time they finally found her, Vivianne Rodger was dead.

Criticalness of Firefighters response time

Resource Planning and Preparedness

 Knowing the exact address helps fire services assess the necessary resources, such as the type of firefighting equipment required and water availability, as well as the potential for evacuation in populated areas.



Community Safety and Risk Assessment

 Street addresses are valuable for identifying high-risk areas, planning fire safety education programs, and conducting routine inspections. This is especially important in densely populated neighborhoods or regions with higher fire risks due to building materials or local activities.



Data Collection and Reporting:

 For post-incident analysis and reporting, accurate addresses allow fire services to document incidents and track patterns over time, helping with future planning, policy-making, and community risk management.



Conclusion

- In summary,
 - clear and precise street addresses support faster response times, improved coordination, and strategic planning, making them indispensable in Fiji's fire safety and emergency management efforts.
 - Fire doubles its size in every minute.
